

**MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING
HELD AT SCOTT CITY HALL
THURSDAY, OCTOBER 4, 2023 AT 6:00 PM**

The Mayor and City Council Members met in Regular Session, Thursday, October 4, 2023. Councilman Montoucet was absent, all other councilman were present.

Councilman Domingue led the Prayer and Pledge.

Councilman Boudreaux motioned to accept the minutes from the September 7, 2023 meeting as written. Seconded by Councilman Domingue, motion approved.

Councilman Boudreaux motioned to accept the August 2023 Financial Statement. Seconded by Councilman Roy.

The Mayor's Report included reminding residents to go vote on October 14th, and to attend the Town Hall Meeting to discuss the Tax Initiatives which is set for October 12th at 6pm- Scott Events Center. He also announced the grand opening and Veteran' Day Program to be held Saturday, November 11th at 9am.

Candidates for Lafayette Mayor President Mrs. Jan Swift and State Representative Ms. Julie Emerson asked for support in the upcoming election to be held on October 14th, 2023.

Mr. Mark Savoy with Groom's Engineering and Mr. Austin Doucet with Fenstermaker Engineering and Associates gave a brief update on on-going projects.

Mayor Richard explained the two tax propositions on the upcoming October 14th ballot.

Councilman Domingue motioned to adopt Resolution 2023-37, a Resolution authorizing the mayor to execute an intergovernmental agreement between the Lafayette City-Parish Consolidated Government and City of Scott the cost sharing of the Dulles Drive overlay. The total cost of the project is estimated to be \$132,836.60 with City of Scott portion 50% and LCG portion 50%. Seconded by Councilman Boudreaux motion carried by majority.

Councilman Boudreaux introduced Ordinance 2023-18, an ordinance amending Sec. 16-21 of the Scott Municipal Code adopting the 2021 edition of the International Fire Code, and any amendments thereto. Fire Chief Chad Sonnier explained that this was to update the code for the inspection of food trucks to meet PIAL requirements. Ordinance 2023-18 will be up for adoption at the next regular council meeting scheduled for November 2nd, 2023 at 6pm.


Councilman Moreau introduced Ordinance 2023-19, an ordinance providing for a moratorium on the approval of Automotive Service/ Mechanic Repair Shops (major and minor) and Automobile Vehicle/ Dealership (used and new). Ordinance 2023-19 will be up for adoption at the next regular council meeting scheduled for November 2nd, 2023

Mayor Richard asked the Council to amend the budget in the amount of \$5,000 for one time seed money the Envision Chamber of Commerce. The money will be reimbursed back to the City. Seconded by Councilman Boudreaux, motion carried by majority.


