

**MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING
HELD AT SCOTT CITY HALL
THURSDAY, April 7, 2022 AT 6:00 PM**

The Mayor and City Council Members met in Regular Session, Thursday, April 7, 2022, all Councilmen were present.

Councilman Hollier led the Prayer and Pledge.

Councilman Montoucet motioned to accept the minutes from the March 3, 2022 meeting as written. Seconded by Councilman Hollier, motion approved.

Councilman Boudreaux motioned to accept the February 2022 Financial Statement. Seconded by Councilman Suire.

Mr. Mark Savoy with Groom's Engineering and Mayor Richard gave a brief update on on-going projects on behalf of Fenstermaker and Associates.

Mayors Report: Mayor Richard reminded everyone of upcoming events in the community. Announced the City of Scott would be receiving an "Abstract Award" for the Provost Pond. National Day of Prayer will be at the Scott Events Center on Thursday, May 5th, 2022 from 11am-1pm.

Mayor Richard announced the City of Scott won the District III Cleanest City Contest. He also recognized the Cleanest City Poster Contest Winners from the local schools as well as committee members.

Councilman Montoucet motioned to adopt plan two Ordinance 2022-2, an Ordinance amending Ordinance 1989-1 and 1994-3, 2002-3 and 2012-14 reapportioning single member voting districts for the City Council for the City of Scott, Louisiana, in accordance with the 2020 Census. All maps were presented on the big screen for public viewing. No discussion. Seconded by Councilman Hollier motion carried unanimously.

City Attorney William Babin appointed two new members: Mr. Norwood Menard and Dr. Robert Richard to the Civil Service.

Councilman Suire introduced Ordinance 2022-3, an Ordinance amending Chapter 14 Environment to add article VIII Heritage Oaks to provide regulations for Heritage Oaks. Ordinance 2022-3 will be up for adoption at the next regular council meeting scheduled for May 7th, at 6pm.

Councilman Bergeron motioned to approve the Code exception for John Wayne Auto Repair located at 110 Gateau Road. Mayor Richard stated that the Planning Commission unanimously approved the code exception. No discussion. Seconded by Councilman Montoucet motion carried unanimously.

Councilman Montoucet motioned the approval of the code exception for Nano Ceramic Protect of Acadiana located at 102 Speedpro Lane. Mayor Richard stated that the

Planning Commission also unanimously approved by the Planning Commission. Seconded by Councilman Bergeron motion carried unanimously.

Councilman Montoucet motion to adopt Resolution 2022-4, A Resolution accepting that certain act of dedication of streets and/or servitudes for subdivision named "The Chateaus." This development was previously known as the "The Cottages" and give a plat and construction approval in 2020. Mr. Mark Savoy with Groom's Engineering stated that all items were satisfactory and recommended the Council to approve. Seconded by Councilman Boudreaux motion carried unanimously.

Councilman Boudreaux motioned to adopt Resolution 2022-6, A Resolution requesting financial assistance from the State of Louisiana under the fiscal year 2021-2022 Local Government Assistance Program and Community Water Enrichment Fund Program. No discussion. Seconded by Councilman Montoucet motion carried unanimously.

Chief Leger led a lengthy discussion and asked for direction for cleanup of the following properties: 1207 Victoria, 723 Marie St, 6212 Cameron St, 4400 Cameron St, and 802 Delhomme Ave. Chief Leger presented the Council the timeline and list of public nuisance violations for each property. In conclusion, this item will be tabled for more research, quotes for cleanup, and a proposed process for action as well as budget.

Mayor Richard also led the discussion for the property located at 3010 W. Willow Street. He stated he spoke to the property owner and will give 30-60 days to clean up or a lien will be placed on the property.

Mayor Richard also led the discussion concerning the parking at the corner of Old Spanish Trail and Alfred Street. A meeting will be schedule with all property owners to discuss options and current site triangle to help with traffic congestion.

There being no further business, meeting adjourned at 8:00 pm.
